Food Label Updates

GMO foods have been on supermarket shelves since the 1990s, but GMO labels have only been required for a year. The USDA says implementation and compliance with the GMO



food labeling program have been "successful," while experts suggest consumers aren't noticing the labels.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration is <u>updating the</u> <u>use of the term "healthy"</u> on food labels for the first time since 1994—in an attempt to align the agency's definition of healthy with the latest nutritional science and federal dietary guidelines.

Big changes for food labels are also <u>happening in</u> <u>South Africa</u>—including sugar warnings as an end to "super-food" labels.

Check out the CAST Issue Paper, <u>Process Labeling of Food</u>: Consumer Behavior, the Agricultural Sector, and Policy Recommendations, released in October 2015.

USDA Updates: The USDA 1) announced an investment in 45 cooperative agreements that support innovative, scalable waste management plans to reduce and divert food waste from landfills, 2) released the latest World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) report, and 3) announced that 2022 was another record year for U.S. farm exports.

Animal Agriculture and Environmental News

Al in Dairy Farms: Examples and opportunities for Al and machine learning in the dairy sector are provided in a recent review.

Super Cows: Scientists said they have <u>successfully</u> <u>cloned three "super cow" calves</u> that, once fully grown, are capable of producing 50% more milk than the average American cow.

Wool Production: The University of Nevada-Reno's sheep program has <u>helped improve wool</u> <u>quality and economics</u> for the range sheep industry.



Penn State found that populations of various species of aquatic insects and other invertebrates respond to flooding and waterway drying in different ways.

Food Science and Safety News

Food Safety: The USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) outlined its <u>key achievements from last year.</u>

Candy: An assistant professor at Mississippi State University discusses <u>how much candy</u> Americans eat each year.

Ready-To-Eat: More than 400 food products—including ready-to-eat sandwiches, salads, yogurts and wraps—were recalled due to possible listeria contamination.



Football fans can expect lower prices on chicken wings this year as another consumption record is expected around Super Bowl LVII, according to a Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service expert.

Plant Agriculture and Environmental News

Fungicide: Some studies suggest that applying fungicides outside the presence of disease can boost yields in corn and soybeans.

Evolution of Wheat: A study has analyzed the evolution of wheat since its cultivation began by the inhabitants of ancient Mesopotamia.

Wildfire Predictions: The latest blog from the Soil Science Society of America discusses how to <u>improve wildfire predictions with soil science</u>.

International News

Agriculture: North Korea has <u>scheduled a major</u> <u>political conference</u> to discuss the "urgent task" of improving its agricultural sector.

Bird Flu: More than 270 H5N1 cases have been confirmed across the country since late October 2021 in the <u>worst outbreak of bird flu</u> the UK has ever experienced.

Agritech in Africa: Three African youth-led agritech businesses will receive mentorship and grants to help them to aggressively expand solutions to long-standing challenges faced by smallholder farmers across the continent.



High-rise hog farms have sprung up nationwide as part of Beijing's drive to enhance its agricultural competitiveness and reduce its dependence on imports.

General Interest

U.S. Ag Exports: The United States' exports of agricultural and related <u>products hit record levels by value in 2022</u>, though higher prices played a big role as volumes across some major items like grain

and meat were down on the year.

Ants: A recent study from NC State University suggests that <u>ants aren't adjusting their behavior</u> in response to warming temperatures.

Tracking COVID: Scientists with the USDA Agricultural Research Service are developing new tests to identify the COVID virus and its variants and tools for tracking the virus in wild and domestic animals.



The U.S. has sent Mexico a request to explain the science behind Mexico's planned bans on genetically modified corn and glyphosate herbicide.
