Planting Ahead of Schedule

Planting season is in full swing across the United States. The <u>USDA NASS's</u> latest planting report showed both <u>corn and soybean</u>



planting to be ahead of average. As of April 23, 2023,14% of the U.S. corn crop is planted. This is up from 6% planted at this time last year. Of that, 3% of the corn crop has emerged. Soybean planting has jumped from 5% to 9% complete so far this year.

These numbers come as Midwest <u>farmers expect</u> <u>below-normal temperatures</u> this upcoming week. The fluctuation in temperature is not unexpected as farmers across the country have already experienced extreme weather events, which have required them to re-plant their crops.

The latest <u>NASS Perspective Planting outlook</u> estimates 92.0 million acres of corn, and 87.5 million acres of soybeans will be planted this year, both slightly higher than 2022.
