Right to Repair

Because of the many technological advancements in modern farm equipment, a farmer's right to repair has been a highly disputed topic for many years. As machinery has become



more technologically advanced, operators have had to pay more often to fix simple problems.

<u>Colorado became the first state to pass "right to repair"</u> <u>legislation this week</u>, which aims to allow farmers more freedom in repairing equipment on the farm. The bill will go into effect next year and ultimately seeks to save farmers money by allowing them more opportunities to make repairs on the farm, instead of taking the machinery to a dealer or mechanic.

<u>This year Colorado and 10 other states have</u> <u>considered similar legislation</u>, which ensures a producer's right to repair as technology continues to develop.

Controlling Animal Diseases: USDA increases efforts to control animal diseases including <u>CWD</u>, <u>bird flu, and FMD</u> in the upcoming farm bill.
